Horningsea Village Hall received 'Hallmark' Award

The Herald congratulates Horningsea Village Hall on the award of South Cambridgeshire's first 'Hallmark 1' certificate. Hallmark is a nationwide certification scheme that monitors not only the physical facilities and maintenance of village halls, but their governance, management and the inclusiveness of users in village-hall administration. The certificate was presented on 1 March by Philip Peacock, Community Facilities Manager of Cambridgeshire ACRE, the organization that oversees Hallmark in Cambridgeshire.

Graham Sanderson, Chairman of the Horningsea Village Hall Trust, received the certificate, flanked by fellow trustees who have been with the Trust since its inception: Cathy Clarke, Mike Hellowell, Mary Parker and John Wilson. In accepting the award, Graham singled out the excellent work performed over many years by his wife Marion (and since taken on by Pauline Hellowell) in ensuring that Village Hall bookings are handled to a high standard.
