The Horningsea Parish Council is exploring an exciting opportunity to bring eco-friendly, sustainable resources to our community—and we want your input! As part of this initiative, we're considering applying for a grant to fund two innovative additions that could benefit villagers of all ages.

#### What's Being Proposed?

#### An Electric Cargo Bike

Imagine an easy, eco-conscious way to get around the village! This electric cargo bike would be ideal for parents transporting children, villagers running errands, or anyone looking to reduce their carbon footprint. Best of all, it would be available for all residents to use.

#### **Solar Panels and Battery Storage**

To power the bike sustainably, we propose installing solar panels and a battery storage system. This step aligns with our ongoing commitment to achieving net zero emissions, ensuring the bike is always charged in an environmentally friendly way.

## **Building work at the Church**

Plans are afoot to repair the floor in the north side of the church and to make the access to the church tower safe. It is a slow process getting the architects specifications, a Faculty (permission from the Diocese) and then find the money to pay for the work. The church council will be applying for grants but may also be asking for help in fundraising. Offers of help will be happily received!

#### **NHS Winter Vaccinations**

NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough is urging anyone eligible for their COVID-19, flu, RSV or pneumococcal vaccines to make sure they've had them this winter. Please check if you, or someone you care for, is eligible - each vaccine has a slightly different eligibility criteria as follows:

- Flu vaccine -- for anyone aged 65 or over (including those who will be 65 by 31 March 2025); have certain long-term health conditions; are pregnant; live in a care home; are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance; or live with someone who has a weakened immune system.
- COVID-19 vaccine -- for anyone aged 65+; those aged between six months and 64 years who are at increased risk of getting seriously ill due to a health condition or treatment; people who live in a care home for older adults, and those who are pregnant; and frontline health and care workers.
- RSV vaccine -- for anyone who is pregnant, or aged 75-79.
- Pneumococcal vaccine -- for anyone 65 or over (only one dose is needed).

A number of issues, not the least of which is the complexity of the project, mean that we have not yet been able to finalise the contract with the principal contractor. This is delaying the start of works despite the contractor being otherwise ready to begin, but at this stage the expected date of completion remains May/June 2025.

The Conservators are pleased to report that we have been working closely with the local authorities to bring additional expertise and practical help into the Conservancy from 1st January 2025.

You must submit by the 2nd or 4th weekend of the month, the Herald being published before the first and third weekends of the month. Submission of any news items implies consent to any editing and the editorial team's decision is always final. **Always send as plain text via email**. Do NOT send formatted documents. Do NOT send articles as PDF or Word files. Stay under 700 words, preferably less. Attach any photos to the email. If you send in a PDF or image of a poster/flyer then attach a paragraph of text to go into the Herald as well.
