

Many of you may be aware that, unfortunately, the village defibrillator was stolen from its cabinet around 15th February. We are working to replace it as soon as possible and are actively pursuing grant applications to cover the cost of a new unit, estimated at approximately £1,000.

We will keep you updated, as restoring this vital, life-saving equipment to the village remains a priority.

# North Entrance Redesign

Following our successful Local Highways Initiative (LHI) bid last year, design work is now underway to improve the north entrance to the village, aiming to reduce traffic speed. We expect to receive the initial designs soon, at which point we will invite community feedback.

# **Horningsea Planning**

#### Save Honey Hill update

Following the end of the DCO Examination Period on the 17th April, 2024, the Planning Inspectors submitted their report to Steve Reed OBE, the new Secretary of State for Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA). DEFRA then had three months in which to make a decision (12th October 2024). After multiple postponements in a statement to the House of Commons Steve Reed stated that the decision must take into account the recently published National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) which had been revised by the new government and formalised on the 12th December 2024. **The new deadline was then set for 14th April 2025.**

#### Plaque to commemorate James M Farmer

As you may be aware we intend to place a plaque in the church on the 19th of July to honour James Farmer a pilot in the USAAF who crashed in Horningsea Fen on this day eighty years ago.

Two men from the village were in the field at the time and went to his assistance when his parachute failed to open, but he sadly died.

James had a distinguished career and received several military honours for his war service.

Peter Halford has designed a plaque and talks are ongoing with the Church Parochial Council as to the placing of the plaque beneath our war memorial

Lindsay Davies has organised several events on that day which will be confirmed later.



The director of the United States Air Museum at Duxford, wishes to be involved and has been instrumental in making contact with relatives of James in the states ,who have since been in touch with me. She has also given me contacts with the American air force who may wish to attend

# Cam Conservancy statement on Baits Bite and Jesus Lock

The Cam Conservancy issued an update on the closure of the locks on the 7th February.

The Conservators are pleased to announce that progress has been made on the construction contract for the stabilisation project at Baits Bite Lock Island. The enabling phase commenced on 29 January 2025.

Conversations have been ongoing with Members of Parliament, Environment Agency, and local authorities to seek external support in expertise and funding. These have been positive and the short and long-term issues facing the Conservancy have been taken seriously.

Matched funding has been offered by the City Council and South Cambridgeshire District Council to appoint temporary expert help to produce a business case and review of the Conservancy's future.

Further updates will follow.
